The «Playable Cities» conference (25 & 26 May 2018)

The conference is an invitation to reflect in a light-hearted manner on play, man as a playful being and towns and cities as a place to live. The "Playable City" concept is an attempt to take account of the need for more inclusive, child-friendly and playful public spaces in a city. Together with invited experts, play will be discussed as a tool for helping to shape urban culture. The conference combines specialist input and presentations with specific pop-up play activities and workshops to create a playful atmosphere and to bring the theme of "Playable Cities" in urban areas to life.

Target group of the conference: Planners and designers of playgrounds from the disciplines of urban design, architecture, landscape architecture, spatial planning, social work, and art and design and play activists.

Pop-up play event «Playable Esplanade» to mark World Play Day (26 May 2018)

A versatile playable urban space will be created on the Esplanade in Biel, and both young and old will be invited to play. The usual play range in the public domain will be contrasted with a potential play range which falls outside of the usual safety standards. We will attempt to discover and develop new uses for public spaces in experimental and playful ways. Interaction and the ability to shape play will replace the humdrum ducks and slides!

The pop-up play activities are open to the public – families with children are welcome!
